Graduation Requirements

- I . The student must complete all grades through 12th grade.
- II . The student's overall grade average through 12th grade must be 60% or higher.
- III. The student must fulfill the attendance requirements through the 12th grade year.
- IV The student must fulfill the conditions of the high school elective program.

MAIN ACTIVITIES

Team Missions

In the middle and high school, teams of students are formed from 7th-12th grades to help them adjust to school life and foster positive relationships between older and younger students. This year, we have 14 teams made up of 16 students each, with 9th and 12thgrade leaders. Team meetings occur every Wednesday, during SA time, and are led by the Student Council.

Variety Show

Every year the Variety Show is planned and directed by the 11th grade while all middle and high school students perform and participate. For one month, they work in planning and executing each grade's performance as well as promotion, decorations, costumes, fundraising, media, and translation, to produce something that is more than just a school recital, but also a worship service of culture and performing arts with a distinctly "Handong" flavor.

Community Week

Students divide into blue and grey teams for community week to compete in events such as volleyball, futsal, basketball, dodgeball, high jump, chess, cup stacking, etc. Students also engage in busking and various fundraising activities.

Expo

All clubs operate booths and prepare special activities or products to introduce their club to visitors.

Science Fair

Middle and high school students showcase their brilliant ideas at the HIS Science Fair. Students exhibite projects in the fields of biology, chemistry, physics, astronomy, computer, mechanical engineering, environmental science, botany, robotics, and psychology.

SKAC Programs

SKAC programs help students to cultivate cross-cultural competencie as they participate in English-conducted programs such as various sports, Speech & Debate, Spelling Bee, MUN. In MUN, the students talk and debate about current issues affecting the world in five different councils with students from the other SKAC schools. These issues include topics such as police brutality, facial recognition software, the Asian air pollution crisis and more

Outdoor Education

HIS students have done various outdoor activities outside the school to have a variety of experiences. Students learn to overcome difficulties and unite as a team in every process. Most events are planned and conducted by students under the guidance of the teacher in charge.

Field Trip: Activities for hands-on knowledge and experiences, such as career experiences and volunteer work.

Camping Trip: Activities to train the mind and body, such as a 100-kilometer march and missionary works, staying together for more than three days.


