Q. You won the grand prize in the Science Fair. Please explain your project.

[S] The theme of our experiment is the one I've been experimenting with since 10th grade. I was curious about how to reduce the spread of germs during the pandemic, which was a year after the pandemic broke out. I found that a doorknob is a strong medium for germs, which led me to delve into how to sterilize them automatically. Ultraviolet light is excellent for sterilization, so it seems feasible to put ultraviolet LEDs on the doorknobs. And, where's the power for LEDs? It can be generated by people opening and closing the doors.

Q. What is the role of HIS in your life?

go out into the world.




How an arrogant coward ended up running a start-up
